Because they are timeless truths based on Scripture, his Great Day teachings continue to be foundational. Jimbo now presides over Breakfast Club. Laura Hollowell and Kelly Carew head up Stumblers. Almost always accompanied by Honey, her new cocker spaniel puppy, Libby continues to teach Bible and lead traditions.

Although I was disappointed that my niece could not be at Junior Camp with me due to recent surgery, I had a blast. My job was to be one of three photographers roaming the campus taking photos of campers then posting them to the Camp's website for parents to view. On opening day we took 1,000 photos! I lived in Cabin 3 with other "out of cabin" staff who all happened to be alumnae. We laughed and laughed and laughed, I became friends with other staff members as we swept the dining hall after meals. One of my favorite duties was serving on the color guard for flag raising and lowering. For several weeks after returning home, the songs "Happy Am I" and "Well, Hello Libby" were on my mind. It was a joy to pass on the Greystone experience to young girls...and to see Greystone thriving in its 91<sup>st</sup> year.

On January 29, 2010, Senior Director Jim Miller, III (JimDaddy) was welcomed into the loving arms of his Lord and Savior, leaving behind a legacy that touched many lives. We remember the lessons he taught us every day at camp as he led Breakfast Club in the dining hall. JimDaddy made us all clap our hands and say, "It's gonna be a great day." This focus on the positive as we learned to grow in the four dimensions (spiritually, socially, mentally, and physically) was the essence of a successful life and a great camp experience.

One of the ways that we best remember JimDaddy was in the role of a servant – sweeping and mopping the floor of the dining hall, picking up trash, mowing the lawn. His humble background gave JimDaddy an appreciation for the value of all work and all workers. He often said that he would have never been able to attend camp, but he would have liked to have done so.

In memory of JimDaddy we have established The Great Day Fund, an endowment fund with the Community Foundation of Henderson County to provide "camperships" (tuition assistance) for girls who cannot otherwise afford a camp experience. It is our goal to never let financial hardship prevent a great camper from attending Greystone. We ask you to consider a generous gift to this endowment. ## 2010 Junior Camp

2010 marked the 11<sup>th</sup> year of Greystone's Junior Camp session. The idea for Junior Camp originated in the late 1990s, when JimDaddy encouraged *Katie Miller Grant* to create and direct this 5-day session held during the week of Memorial Day.

### Katie Miller Grant's Vision for Junior Camp

As the session's director, Katie Miller Grant brings many years of experience in all facets of camp operation, her love for Greystone traditions, and an extremely supportive management style that is immensely appreciated by the staff.

Katie's vision was to introduce girls who had completed Kindergarten through the 4<sup>th</sup> grade to Greystone through a 5-day session. The Junior Camp daily schedule is similar to that of the longer sessions: meals, morning assembly, activities, rest hour, and evening program. In other ways, Junior Camp is tailored to the younger age group. For example, each tentalow attends program activities together, accompanied by their counselor. Given the session's short duration, each tentalow does each program activity *once*. The skill level of classes such as archery and tennis is elementary. Other classes include cooking, crafts, swimming, and water park. To ensure an ideal environment for these young campers, enrollment is limited to approximately 325 as compared to 480 or so for the longer sessions.

In one word, Junior Camp is "FUN." To say that these campers are enthusiastic hardly communicates their energy level! They are excited about their tentalows, their activities, the evening programs, and just being at Greystone. At meals, they carefully study song sheets so that they can sing (over and over and over) "Happy Am I," "Well, Hello Libby," "Smile," and "I Don't Want to March In the Infantry." For some of them, being at Junior Camp is their first "away from home" experience. Many have attended Junior Camp before.

### Junior Camp Staff

*Emily "Smith" Houts*, Junior Camp's Assistant Director, began her Greystone career in 1965. A retired elementary school teacher, "Smith" knows how to motivate and encourage young children...and also how to keep the camp operating on schedule.

Anyone who has worked with "Smith" knows she is hilariously funny! For Junior Camp 2010, she placed dinosaur characters on the nametags of out of cabin staff and group leaders as a joke on their relatively older age. No offense was taken, given that she fits into the dinosaur category herself!

The Junior Camp staff is fairly evenly divided between "cabin counselors" who are mostly college-aged or in their twenties and "The Mom Squad" (older "out of cabin" staff who teach the program activities.) In addition, given her MANY years of experience at Greystone and also as a nanny, *Fran Crook* plays a key role as a tentalow counselor.

A large number of "The Mom Squad" are alumnae, and many are mothers who volunteer to mentor the college-aged tentalow counselors. There is an astonishing 90% return rate for "out of cabin" staff. They return year after year to pass on the Greystone experience to the next generation .... and to see their friends.

Proceeds from the weekend benefited the Great Day Fund, which provides scholarships for Greystone campers (see page 3). Approximately 60 alumnae from 12 states attended, with most staying in cabins at camp. Many thanks to Gervais Hollowell for such great food cooked in the recently remodeled kitchen!

The weekend began on Friday by honoring JimDaddy through flag lowering. After supper came Greystone movies in White Hall. Some stayed up late talking with friends and others went to bed early to get ready for the big race on the next morning.

All 60 reunion attendees participated in the race either by running, walking, or cheering on this sunny, crisply cool Saturday morning. **Deaths in the Greystone Family**

Greystone sends much love to *Jeanne Ashmore*, whose husband, Jerry, died on November 8, 2010, and to their daughters *Cathy Ashmore Pederson* and *Lisa Ashmore Maybin*. For many years during the 1980s-1990s, Jeanne and Jerry directed Greystone's riding program. In recent years, Jeanne has worked on the staff at Greystone's shorter sessions.

Greystone also sends much love to the entire Crook family for the death of Jim Crook on February 9, 2011. As a Presbyterian minister, Jim officiated at Libby and Jim Miller's wedding, Jimbo Miller's and Whittaker Warrington's baptisms, and Virginia Sevier Hanna's funeral. Jim's wife, *Jean Hooper Crook*, was a counselor in the 1940s and a counselor/head counselor in the 1970s. Their four daughters, *Ginger Crook Haas*, *Polly Crook Robinson*, *Catherine Crook Woodcock*, and *Fran Crook* were at Greystone for many years (Fran still is!). Just behind them are the **one foot tall pines** that grew to towering height in later years. One of my most cherished visual memories of Greystone is of this road. So, I felt sad to learn that the pines would be cut because they had become diseased and a safety hazard. I appreciated so much the "goodbye" photo and caption that Laura Green Hollowell included in the 2010 alumnae reunion Snapfish album:



"These beautiful pines graced our campus for almost 90 years. They spent their last weekend at Greystone with us during our reunion. A new generation of trees will now stand guard. We will watch them grow as their predecessors watched us grow."
